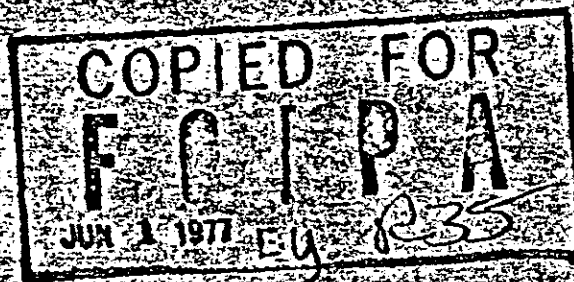

SUBJECT: J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER
INTERNAL SECURITY - R

On April 4, 1952, KENNETH SANBORN PITZER, Dean of the School of Chemistry at the University of California, Berkeley, California, requested that Agents of this office contact him. It is to be noted that PITZER was the subject of an AEEA investigation.

PITZER was interviewed on April 4, 1952, by Special Agents RICHARD G. FLETCHER and JAMES P. NYE.

PITZER stated that the reason he had requested this interview was to have recorded in the FBI files the fact that his opinion of Dr. J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER is no longer the same as it was at the time he was interviewed approximately five years ago by Special Agents of this Bureau, at which time they were conducting an investigation of OPPENHEIMER under the Atomic Energy program. It is to be noted that Dr. PITZER was previously interviewed in 1947 at which time PITZER advised Special Agents DAVID E. TODD and CHARLES F. BRUSCH that he, PITZER, had the utmost confidence in both the loyalty and scientific ability of Dr. OPPENHEIMER. He further stated that Dr. OPPENHEIMER at that time was an advisor to the Northern California Association of Scientists and had been very much disturbed at the Northern California Association of Scientists' statement which had been made in opposition to aid for Greece.

PITZER stated that he now is doubtful as to the loyalty of Dr. OPPENHEIMER. He stated that this doubt is primarily based on two reasons. First, at the time the question was being decided as to the position to be taken on whether the United States should work on the development of the H-Bomb, J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER took the position of opposing the development of the H-Bomb. Dr. PITZER stated that not only did OPPENHEIMER oppose it personally, but that he attempted to influence other members of the Commission and other influential persons to also oppose it. The second reason was that even though OPPENHEIMER'S position of opposing the development of the H-Bomb was overruled by the President, OPPENHEIMER stayed on as Chairman and as such has been impeding progress on this work. When asked for specifics as to how he was impeding the progress of this work, Dr. PITZER stated that OPPENHEIMER has been instrumental in persuading other outstanding scientists not to work on this project, particularly the project at Los Alamos. When asked for the

names of individuals whom OPPENHEIMER had persuaded not to work on the H-Bomb but to engage in other type work, PITZER stated he thought HANS BETHE was one and that he believes there were others, although he could not specifically recall their names at this time. He stated, however, that EDWARD TELLER, who is head of the work at Los Alamos, if TELLER decides to talk, could furnish more names.

It is recalled that HANS BETHE is the scientist whom JULIUS ROSENBERG allegedly received atomic energy information from through ALFRED SARANT.

When asked for specifics as to instances wherein the decisions of OPPENHEIMER have delayed development on the H-Bomb, PITZER stated that he could not furnish any himself but rather it would take a scientist like TELLER or one W. F. LIBBY, presently stationed at Chicago, to evaluate such instances. PITZER stated, however, that in his opinion it can be documented that OPPENHEIMER has blocked progress on the H-Bomb while acting as Chairman of the Scientific Committee of the AEC.

PITZER stated that another item which he would like clarified pertains to the information which he had previously furnished relative to OPPENHEIMER's making it a point to see PITZER personally and express disappointment at the press release issued by the Northern California Association of Scientists opposing the military aid to Greece. PITZER said that at the time he previously talked to the Agents he cited this as an example of OPPENHEIMER'S patriotism. However, upon further reflection upon the matter and particularly since reading the testimony of PAUL CROUCH, it occurred to him that such a visit to him by OPPENHEIMER, which seemed unusual to him, might have been made with an ulterior motive to deceive PITZER as to his real feelings. PITZER stated, however, that the above was merely an opinion on his part.

PITZER stated that the above situation with regard to J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER has caused him considerable concern and that he has discussed this matter with Dr. LOUIS ALVAREZ and Dr. E. O. LAWRENCE, both of whom are also concerned about the fact that OPPENHEIMER has continued as Chairman of the Advisory Committee of the Atomic Energy Commission while opposing its development in the first instance.

PITZER advised that he has no personal grievance with OPPENHEIMER and that the above had nothing to do with his leaving the Commission.

He further stated that he had discussed with GORDON DEAN, Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission, the fact that OPPENHEIMER was allowed to continue as Chairman of the Advisory Committee of the AEC although he had opposed the H-Bomb development. PITZER further stated that he is of the opinion that the Secretary of Defense is aware of the above situation with regard to J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER through their liaison representative with the Atomic Energy Commission.

Dr. PITZER stated that he is very much concerned about the above at the present time inasmuch as it is his opinion that J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER is now "making a play" to be reappointed.

Dr. PITZER stated that he would prefer that the above information not be furnished to the present commissioners of the Atomic Energy Commission for strong personal reasons. He stated, however, that in the event this Bureau felt it was necessary to advise the Commission that he would appreciate it if utmost care would be taken to conceal his identity.

No further action is being taken in this matter by the San Francisco Office at this time, but it is suggested that in view of the sensitiveness of J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER's position and the seriousness of the allegations that the Bureau consider furnishing this information to the President.

PURPOSE:

Dr. Kenneth S. Pitzer, University of California, advised he is doubtful as to the loyalty of Dr. Oppenheimer since he opposed the development of the H-Bomb and yet remained as Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission Advisory Committee and has been impeding progress on the H-Bomb Project. Hans Bethe identified as an individual who was possibly persuaded by Dr. Oppenheimer not to work on the H-Bomb. Dr. Pitzer claimed that Edward Teller and W. F. Libby would be able to evaluate instances wherein Dr. Oppenheimer's decisions have delayed development of the H-Bomb. Information being furnished to the Department, Admiral Solvers, and the Atomic Energy Commission. Bethe, Teller, and Libby will be interviewed regarding allegation.

DETAILS:

Dr. Kenneth Sanborn Pitzer, Dean of the School of Chemistry, University of California, Berkeley, California, advised on April 4, 1952, that he is now doubtful as to the loyalty of Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer, Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission Advisory Committee. Dr. Pitzer stated that his doubt is based primarily on two factors. First, Oppenheimer has opposed the development of the H-Bomb and has attempted to influence other individuals to oppose it, and second, as Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission Advisory Committee, he has impeded the progress of the work on the H-Bomb.

Dr. Pitzer stated he could not specifically recall the names of individuals whom Oppenheimer had persuaded not to work on the H-Bomb but he thought that Hans Bethe might have been one. In addition, Dr. Pitzer stated that Dr. Edward Teller, if he decides to talk, could furnish additional names. Regarding specific instances where Dr. Oppenheimer's decisions have delayed development

of the H-Bomb, Dr. Pitzer stated that scientists like Dr. Teller and W. F. Libby of Chicago would be able to evaluate such instances. Dr. Pitzer claimed that in his opinion, the fact that Dr. Oppenheimer has blocked progress on the H-Bomb can be documented.

Re Hans Albrecht Bethe:

Bethe, born Strasbourg, Germany, July 2, 1906, has been Professor of Physics at Cornell University since 1935. From 1943 to 1946, he served as Division Leader in the Theoretical Physics Department at Los Alamos, New Mexico. Bethe has admitted close association with Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs, confessed Soviet agent, since 1934. In connection with an interview by newspaper reporters in February, 1950, Bethe is reported to have stated off the record that he could understand why Fuchs did what he did since "after all, a scientist is of the world and works for the world."

David Greenglass, confessed Soviet agent, on July 2, 1951, advised he had furnished Bethe's name, among others, to Harry Gold as a possible Soviet espionage recruit.

An investigation is presently being conducted in connection with Bethe's contacts and association with individuals involved in the Julius Rosenberg case. (65-60393)

Re Dr. Edward Teller:

Dr. Teller, born in Hungary, is Professor of Physics at the University of Chicago, and was employed on research in connection with the H-Bomb at Los Alamos until November 6, 1951. Investigation regarding Teller revealed that his name was associated with the United American - Spanish Aid Committee and Washington Committee for Democratic Action, Communist front groups. He was alleged to be possibly identical with the instructor at the Communist Workers School in New York in 1941. (116-2713)

Re Dr. Willard Frank Libby:

Dr. Libby, born 1908, Colorado, is Professor of Chemistry at the Institute of Nuclear Studies, Chicago. Dr. Libby has been contacted by the Chicago Office in the past regarding atomic energy matters and has been cooperative.

OBSERVATIONS:

It is noted that AEC Commissioner Thomas Murray recently alleged that Oppenheimer imposes a tremendous influence on the Atomic Energy Program since the Atomic Energy Commission Advisory Committee can exert influence over the extent of production, expansion, and stockpiling. Commissioner Murray indicated he intended to oppose Oppenheimer's reappointment to the Advisory Committee.

The New York Times for March 8, 1952, carried an article reporting recent remarks of Dr. Kenneth Sanborn Pitzer before the American Chemical Societies in which he charged that there has been serious and unnecessary delays in the Atomic Energy Program. Dr. Pitzer reportedly stated that more than one of the influential members on the General Advisory Committee seem to have "remarkably little enthusiasm for the primary goals of the Atomic Energy Commission."

Dissemination:

Information regarding this matter is being furnished to the Department, Admiral Souers, and the Atomic Energy Commission.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that Dr. Bethe, Dr. Teller, and Dr. Libby be interviewed in order to resolve the allegations made by Dr. Pitzer regarding Dr. Oppenheimer.

ACTION:

There are attached communications to the Department, Admiral Souers, and the Atomic Energy Commission.

There is also attached a letter requesting the interviews with Drs. Teller, Bethe, and Libby be conducted, in the event you approve.

Dr. WILLARD F. DETAILS: AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

Doctor WILLARD F. LIBBY, Professor, Chemistry Department, Room 442, Research Institute Building, University of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois, who is also a member of the General Advisory Committee to the Atomic Energy Commission, and a member of the Committee of Senior Responsible Reviewers of the Atomic Energy Commission, advised on May 6, 1952 that he had known J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER since 1930 when he, Doctor LIBBY, was a student at the University of California at Berkeley, California. Doctor LIBBY stated that he had taken a course in the Physics Department of the University of California under Doctor OPPENHEIMER. Doctor LIBBY informed that his contact with Doctor OPPENHEIMER over the past twenty-two years has been infrequent. He stated that during the early and middle 1930's, while at Berkeley, California, he had occasional social contact with the subject. Doctor LIBBY advised that since the end of World War II, he has been in contact with OPPENHEIMER on occasions and that during the past year to year and one-half has had considerable contact with the subject due to the fact that both he and OPPENHEIMER are members of the General Advisory Committee to the Atomic Energy Commission. Doctor LIBBY stated he had met OPPENHEIMER's wife on two occasions, both contacts being during the past two years.

In regard to whether or not Doctor OPPENHEIMER had opposed the development of the H-bomb, Doctor LIBBY informed that it was his belief that OPPENHEIMER had opposed development of the H-bomb. He stated, however, that the General Advisory Committee had advised the Atomic Energy Commission not to work on the H-bomb, and that he believed this recommendation on the part of the General Advisory Committee was a matter of public record as a result of testimony before the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy Matters, headed by Senator MC MAHON. Doctor LIBBY said that he believes but is not certain that possibly OPPENHEIMER had gone to President TRUMAN and expressed his views opposing the development of the H-bomb. Doctor LIBBY informed that he was not a member of the General Advisory Committee at the time consideration was being given to the development of the H-bomb and that the above was largely "scuttlebutt" on his part. He informed that the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy Matters should be in possession of testimony by Doctor OPPENHEIMER which would reflect the subject's views in this regard. He added that he believed that since the General Advisory Committee had recommended to the Atomic Energy Commission that the H-bomb not be developed, that it was a reasonable assumption that Doctor OPPENHEIMER opposed the development of the H-bomb since he was the chairman of the General Advisory Committee. Doctor LIBBY remarked "his consistent course

of behavior has indicated that he does not feel he was originally wrong in opposing development of the H-bomb."

Doctor LIBBY related that he had on several occasions been in disagreement with OPPENHEIMER on policy matters concerning the Atomic Energy program. LIBBY explained that OPPENHEIMER had a tendency to take things slowly while he, LIBBY, favored a more energetic and rapid build-up of the Atomic Energy program. LIBBY further explained that while he personally favored an all-out development of the Atomic Energy program, OPPENHEIMER generally favored the conservative approach. Doctor LIBBY stated, however, in this regard that OPPENHEIMER was usually supported in his views by Doctor JAMES B. CONANT, President, Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts, and Doctor LEE A. DU BRIDGE, President, California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, California. Doctor LIBBY added that he sometimes had the feeling that perhaps CONANT and DU BRIDGE were taken in or persuaded in their views by OPPENHEIMER. He stated that this might not be true as both men were capable of making decisions on their own. He advised that he was unable to be more specific in this regard.

Doctor LIBBY stated that he knew of no case where Doctor OPPENHEIMER tried to persuade scientists not to work on the H-bomb, but stated that he was in no position to know if such had or had not occurred. In this regard, Doctor LIBBY stated that the Director of the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory, Los Alamos, New Mexico, or the head of the Physics Division at Los Alamos might know if OPPENHEIMER had ever tried to persuade scientists not to work on the H-bomb. Doctor LIBBY also mentioned that FREDERICK DE HOFFMAN, a scientist at Los Alamos who was formerly secretary of the Committee of Senior Responsible Reviewers, might have information in this regard as he was usually well informed on the scientists working at Los Alamos. Doctor LIBBY suggested that Admiral LEWIS STRAUSS, 30 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, New York, be interviewed. Doctor LIBBY stated that Admiral STRAUSS was an ex-Atomic Energy Commissioner who was acquainted with OPPENHEIMER and who was familiar with Atomic Energy Commission affairs. Doctor LIBBY was asked to state specific examples as to where OPPENHEIMER may have impeded progress of work on the H-bomb. He stated that the best example was the fact that OPPENHEIMER had "knocked the program at it's birth." LIBBY pointed out in this regard that OPPENHEIMER's position was largely of an advisory capacity and that while he had a strong influence, he was not in an administrative position where he could deliberately cause delay in the H-bomb program.

In regard to the loyalty of Doctor OPPENHEIMER to the United States Government, Doctor LIBBY stated that OPPENHEIMER probably knows more about this vital type of information than anyone else because of his long experience and access to confidential information, and that for this reason he should be checked with extreme care. Doctor LIBBY added, however, that he believed anyone working in a key position on Atomic Energy matters should be checked with extreme care. Doctor LIBBY stated that he did not desire to make a positive statement as to OPPENHEIMER's loyalty, and he pointed out in this connection he has been acquainted with EMIL JULIUS KLAUS FUCHS, who was convicted of espionage in England, and BRUNO PONTECORVO, an atomic scientist who disappeared in 1950. He stated that based on his association with FUCHS and PONTECORVO he had no reason to suspect them of being in any way disloyal and that for this reason he was hesitant to make a positive statement regarding anyone's loyalty.

Doctor LIBBY advised that OPPENHEIMER's term as a member of the General Advisory Committee to the Atomic Energy Commission was due to expire in a few weeks and that he personally believed that it would be extremely wise not to reappoint him. Doctor LIBBY stated that the reason for his belief in this regard was not based on security reasons but was based on his belief that OPPENHEIMER lacked the necessary enthusiasm for the program.

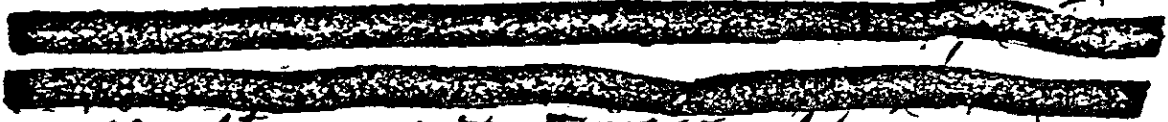

Secretary of Defense Charles Wilson called me today concerning the ^{with} copy of the Borden letter regarding Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer which I had sent him and inquired how reliable a person was Mr. Borden. I told Mr. Wilson that Mr. Borden was the Chief of Staff of the Joint Committee on Atomic Energy under Brian McMahon and left when Senator Hickenlooper took over this Committee, but I understood that even now he is a special Consultant to the Joint Committee. I stated we had arranged to send an Agent from Washington to Pittsburgh to interview Mr. Borden and go down the line on the statements he has made in this letter the first thing tomorrow morning so as to ascertain what he predicates his statements on. I stated the Secretary would recall that there were some very specific statements made, that there were no qualifications, and I felt we ought to have those tied down, because if he is still connected with the Joint Committee, it is entirely possible that the above communication to me has been given to the Joint Committee, altho I did not know this to be the fact. I stated when I received this letter I was a little bit surprised at the length and specificity of it and I felt then that there were certain implications which we should certainly mention.

Secretary then quoted the last sentence of the letter from Mr. Borden, to the effect that the letter was written exclusively on his own personal initiative and responsibility and the Secretary asked if I had any reason to believe that this was so. I stated I did not know anything to the contrary but by the nature of my associations in this work, I had my suspicions. I stated I did know that at one time Senator Joseph McCarthy was very seriously contemplating going into the matter. I stated Senator McCarthy discussed it with me and I cautioned him to watch his step in view of the implications involved and the possibility of a superficial approach to it, knowing that Dr. Oppenheimer is a pretty clever individual.

I stated the Senator must have decided not to go into the matter. I stated in this particular letter, I did not know whether Borden was solely going on record and what I might later be confronted with the question of what the FBI did about it, which is why I saw fit to make the dissemination we did so everybody could be advised of exactly what we had on hand. The Secretary commented that everyone was pretty stirred up about it.

I stated the Attorney General, General Cutler, and myself had had a conference about 2:30 this afternoon and were briefed as to the conference with the President this morning, at which conference I stated I thought the Secretary,

himself, was present. I stated the only thing which entered my mind was the wisdom of bringing this matter into a hearing, because I thought Dr. Oppenheimer would demand a public hearing, which I felt had very serious implications and undesirable aspects because not only is some of the information contained in the main file of a very confidential character; but, in addition, if there is an open hearing certain things cannot be brought out by reason of their confidential background or the source of the information, and it would probably result in a vindication, and then a martyr would have been made of an individual who we know morally is a security risk. I stated both the Attorney General and I felt the same about this, and we both expressed our fears to General Cutler. The Secretary stated the letter from Mr. Borden pointed out that in the period 1939-1942 Dr. Oppenheimer did some things and lied about them, which was the period when the Germans and the Russians were friendly. The Secretary said that while the war was going on and we were partners with the Russians, Dr. Oppenheimer had no trouble with his Communism, but the question was what he had done since, or what he did in the 1939-42 period which could be proved. Knowing the make-up of Dr. Oppenheimer, I commented he probably would try to make quite an issue of this matter if he is to be confronted with it. I stated my feeling was, and the Attorney General agreed, that the issue might be better met by abolition of the Committee which would automatically cancel his clearance without any formal confrontation of charges.

The Secretary asked if we had run across any connection of Dr. Oppenheimer with Alger Hiss or the Rosenbergs, etc. I stated that we hadn't; that his activities were largely limited to the early stages of the Project. I also stated there was no question in my mind about Dr. Oppenheimer, but the question of being able to prove anything, openly or legally, as I thought they would be forced to do if they went into any open hearing on the matter, was another problem. I stated that presently our records were being checked to see what could be used publicly if this became necessary and I thought careful evaluation should be given as to how it would be handled, whether it would be by Arthur Flemming, or by a board or a committee, and it would then be necessary to consider the personnel on such. The Secretary asked if the foregoing was on the assumption that this was the only remaining technical relation Dr. Oppenheimer has with the present administration. I stated this was correct; that I understood from General Cutler that he had been asked to check up on any contractual relations they might have. I stated if it was only on this one particular thing

then there was an easy way out of it. The Secretary advised that Dr. Oppenheimer served as a consultant at the Department of Defense for seven days the first part of this year, but the arrangement expired on June 30. He was informed if there were no other contracts with Dr. Oppenheimer then I thought the problem was a little more simple than it would be if they had to terminate any specific contracts which ran into next year. The Secretary then asked what would be the best way

to cancel Dr. Oppenheimer's technical clearance, which he could use as an entre in discussions with various kinds of people, or where he might use it to become a consultant to a contractor doing work of a special nature for them. I stated I imagined that this would have to be done through the Atomic Energy Commission or through the Defense Department. I stated as far as General Cutler knew, there was only a question in regard to that one committee and the so-called "Q" clearance. I stated that, of course, if the committee is abolished and there is no further work for the committee, the "Q" clearance could be automatically revoked on that basis alone. I stated if a question came up later, where somebody wanted to use Dr. Oppenheimer, a decision could be made then.

I further pointed out that if there were other contracts involved, then another question would arise as to the disposition of this matter, but so far as General Cutler knew there was only the one committee. The Secretary indicated this committee could be abolished and another one set up in its place. I commented this would automatically revoke the clearance for that particular committee and Dr. Oppenheimer would just not be placed on a new committee.

The Secretary then mentioned that Senator McCarthy could have an investigation of Oppenheimer and I replied that this was something I thought could be controlled provided the appropriate action was taken in the Executive Department. The Secretary asked if I thought Senator McCarthy had a copy of Borden's letter and I stated I did not know but I would not put it past the realm of possibility, but I thought if he did have it and contemplated taking action upon it more than likely he would first contact General Persons and maybe Admiral Strauss, and he might contact me because he has an entirely cordial relationship with all three of us.

Reference is made to my communication dated November 27, 1953, forwarding copies of a letter addressed to me from Mr. William L. Borden, former Staff Director, Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy, which pertained to Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer.

Further reference is made to my communication dated December 7, 1953, forwarding a copy of a memorandum dated December 4, 1953, containing the results of an interview with Mr. Borden.

At the time Mr. Borden was interviewed, he admitted that all of his data concerning Oppenheimer's Communist and related affiliations originated with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Borden furnished the names of twenty-two individuals who might be in a position to furnish information with respect to Oppenheimer's opposition toward the development of the H-Bomb. The individuals named by Borden are set forth as follows, together with identifying data concerning them:

1. ^{Kenneth} Robert S. Pitzer, an atomic scientist. This individual has previously been interviewed concerning this same matter and the results set forth in our summary memorandum on Oppenheimer which was furnished to you on June 25, 1953.
2. E. O. Lawrence, Director of the Radiation Laboratory, University of California. This individual was investigated for atomic energy clearance in 1947. The investigation reflected that he was a loyal citizen and that he was highly regarded. He is a former Nobel Prize winner and the inventor of the cyclotron.

3. Edward Teller, an atomic scientist. This individual has previously been interviewed concerning this same matter and the results set forth in our summary memorandum on Oppenheimer which was furnished to you on June 25, 1953.

4. Major General Leslie Groves, former Head of the Manhattan Engineer District.

5. Lewis Strauss, present Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission.

6. Thomas E. Murray, presently Commissioner, Atomic Energy Commission.

7. Harold Urey, an atomic scientist, at the University of Chicago. Urey is presently the subject of an espionage investigation and the subject of a reinvestigation for atomic energy clearance by this Bureau. Urey is considered one of the five outstanding scientists who developed the original atomic bomb for which he was awarded the Medal of Merit. In the past, he has been affiliated with over twelve Communist front organizations, has associated with Communist Party members and sympathizers and according to a reliable informant, he had contacted Jerome Carden in August, 1953, in Switzerland. Carden is reported to be the atomic expert for the French Communist Party and Urey allegedly gave him data concerning atomic energy progress and research in the United States. Urey has always been an advocate of civil rights and free speech. He has publicly announced that in his opinion there was a reasonable doubt concerning the evidence that convicted Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, and he publicly requested clemency for the Rosenbergs prior to their prosecution, conviction and execution. He has previously opposed security regulations at Atomic Energy Commission installations. He is a former Nobel Prize winner.

8. Enrico Fermi, an atomic scientist at the University of Chicago. Fermi was the subject of investigation in 1947 for atomic energy clearance. He is a Nobel Prize winner, is highly regarded and considered very "security minded." He has been awarded the Medal of Merit. No derogatory data was developed during the investigation.

9. Luis Alvarez, an atomic scientist at the University of California. Alvarez was the subject of an investigation for atomic energy clearance in 1947. The investigation disclosed that he was not particularly security conscious while working for the Manhattan Engineer District.

10. Lawrence Hafstad, an atomic scientist for the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission, Washington, D. C. Hafstad was the subject of an investigation for atomic energy clearance in 1947. No derogatory data was developed during the investigation. In 1952, an informant of unknown reliability stated that Hafstad was a very close friend of Joseph and Stewart Alsop, well-known newspaper columnists.

11. Donald Cooksey, Associate Director of the Radiation Laboratory at the University of California. Cooksey was the subject of an investigation for atomic energy clearance in 1947. The investigation reflected that he was well regarded and is considered a loyal citizen.

12. Dave Griggs, former scientific advisor to the Air Force.

13. Gary Naughton, Special Assistant to the Secretary of the Air Force.

14. Thomas K. Finletter, former Secretary of the Air Force.

15. Robert LeBaron, Chairman, Military Liaison Committee, Office of the Secretary of Defense.

16. _____ Penney, Director of a British atomic center, not Harwell.

17. Colonel _____ Hitts, former Assistant to the former Secretary of the Air Force Pinletter.

18. George Veil, former Assistant Director of Reactor Development, U. S. Atomic Energy Commission. Veil was the subject of an investigation for atomic energy clearance in 1947. The investigation reflected that he is well regarded and no disloyal data was developed.

19. Dave Teeple, Special Assistant to the Atomic Energy Commission Chairman, Lewis Strauss.

20. John Walker, a New York attorney who was formerly employed by the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy.

21. Frank Cotter, Security Officer for the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy.

22. Hans Bethe, an atomic scientist at the University of Chicago. This individual has previously been interviewed concerning this same matter and the results set forth in our summary memorandum on Oppenheimer which was furnished to you on June 25, 1953.

According to Mr. Borden, all of the above individuals have at some time in the past been either close friends or associated with Dr. Oppenheimer. If these individuals were now interviewed concerning Dr. Oppenheimer, in all probability, Oppenheimer would learn of our interest and our investigation of him. Your opinion is requested as to whether or not any or all of the above individuals should be interviewed concerning this matter. An early reply will be appreciated.

SYNOPSIS:

William L. Borden, former Staff Director, Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy, furnished the names of 22 individuals who might be able to supply data concerning Oppenheimer's influence over other scientists not to work on the development of the H-bomb. The names and identifying data concerning these 22 individuals set forth in details of memorandum. Three are scientists who were previously interviewed in 1952 concerning this same phase of the Oppenheimer investigation; two are present AEC Commissioners; one an AEC advisor; one the former Secretary of Air Force Finletter; three present and past advisors to the Air Force; one present and one past employee of the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy; one British scientist; General Groves, former head of the Manhattan Engineer District; eight atomic scientists or individuals closely associated with the atomic program. If these individuals are now interviewed, the possibility exists that Oppenheimer would become aware of the Bureau's interest and investigation of him.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the names of the individuals furnished by Borden with data from Bufiles be furnished to the Department for an opinion as to whether or not they should be interviewed. If you agree a letter to the Attorney General is attached for approval.

DETAILS:

Pittsburgh teletype dated December 4, 1959, containing the results of an interview with William L. Borden, former Staff Director, Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy, concerning Oppenheimer, listed the names of 22 individuals furnished by Borden who might be able to furnish additional information concerning Oppenheimer. In this connection, Borden has admitted that all of his data concerning Oppenheimer's Communist affiliations is contained in Bureau files. According to Borden, the 22 individuals named by him might be able to furnish information with respect to Oppenheimer's opposition to the development of the H-bomb and his efforts to get others not to work on the H-bomb.

The individuals named by Borden are set forth below together with identifying data. It should be noted that three of the individuals have previously been interviewed concerning this phase of the Oppenheimer investigation.

- 1) ^{KENNETH} ~~Robert~~ S. Pitzer - atomic scientist. Previously interviewed concerning this matter.
- 2) E. O. Lawrence - Director of the Radiation Laboratory, University of California. Bureau files reflect Lawrence was investigated for atomic energy clearance in 1947. Investigation reflected that he was highly regarded and a loyal citizen. Some years ago he had been in contact with Soviet Consulate officials but the contacts were believed to be of a routine nature and no evidence of a compromise of secret data or disloyalty was disclosed. He is a former Nobel Prize winner and the inventor of the cyclotron. He has been contacted many times in the past. He has always been cooperative and frequently expressed the desire to assist the Bureau. (116-10798)
- 3) Edward Teller - atomic scientists. Previously interviewed concerning this matter.
- 4) Major General Leslie Groves - former head of Manhattan Engineer District.
- 5) Lewis Strauss - present Chairman, AEC. He has been in close contact with the Bureau and the Director and has been currently furnishing data concerning Oppenheimer.
- 6) (Thomas E.) Murray - present Commissioner, AEC. He has been in close contact with the Bureau and the Director and has been currently furnishing data concerning Oppenheimer.

7) Harold Urey - atomic scientist, University of Chicago. Urey is the present subject of an espionage investigation and a re-investigation for atomic energy clearance. He is considered one of the five outstanding scientists who developed the original atomic bomb for which he was awarded the Medal of Merit. In the past he has been affiliated with over 12 Communist front organizations, has associated with Communist Party members and sympathizers, and according to a reliable informant, he contacted Jerome Cardan in August, 1959, in Switzerland. Cardan is reported to be the atomic energy expert for the French Communist Party and Urey allegedly gave him data concerning atomic energy progress and research in the United States. Urey has always been an advocate of free speech and civil rights. He is of the opinion that there was a reasonable doubt concerning the evidence that convicted Julius and Ethel Rosenberg and he publicly requested clemency for the Rosenbergs prior to their prosecution for espionage. He has "publicly opposed FBI and Government attorney decisions of guilt" on the part of the Rosenbergs. He has previously opposed security rules at AEC installations. Many of his co-workers consider him a loyal citizen and he is a former Nobel Prize winner.

8) Enrico Fermi - atomic scientist, University of Chicago. He was investigated in 1947 for an atomic energy clearance. He is a naturalized U. S. citizen of Italian origin. He formerly worked on atomic energy research under the Manhattan Engineer District. He is a Nobel Prize winner, is well regarded, and considered very security minded. It has been reported that he has always taken the lead to safeguard research matters. He has been awarded the Medal of Merit. (116-1255)

9) Luis Alvarez - atomic scientist, University of California. He was investigated for atomic energy clearance in 1947. Investigation reflected that he was not particularly security conscious while working for the MED but no other disloyal data was developed. (116-7905)

10) Lawrence Hafstad - atomic scientist, U. S. Atomic Energy Commission, Washington, D. C. He was investigated for atomic energy clearance in 1947. Investigation reflected that he was a well regarded, loyal citizen. No derogatory data was developed. Dave Teeple informed in 1952 that Hafstad was a very close friend of Joe and Stewart Alsop, newspaper columnists who have been suspected of obtaining classified atomic energy and other data for publishing in their newspaper column. (116-9726)

11) (Donald) Cooksey - Associate Director, Radiation Laboratory, University of California. He was investigated for atomic energy clearance in 1947. Investigation reflected that he was well regarded, is thoroughly loyal and security conscious. No derogatory data was obtained. (116-10597)

12) Dave Griggs - former scientific advisor to the Air Force.

13) Gary Naughten - Special Assistant to the Secretary of the Air Force.

14) (Thomas K.) Finletter - former Secretary of the Air Force.

15) Robert LeBaron - Chairman, Military Liaison Committee, Office of the Secretary of Defense. He was recently interviewed concerning his knowledge of Oppenheimer's Communist affiliation. He was investigated for atomic energy clearance in 1942 and no derogatory data was developed. (116-147242)

16) Penny - Director of a British atomic energy center, not Harwell.

17) Colonel Hitts - former Assistant to former Secretary of the Air Force Finletter.

18) George Weil - former Assistant Director of Reactor Development, U. S. Atomic Energy Commission. He was investigated for atomic energy clearance in 1947. The investigation reflected that he is well regarded. No disloyal data was developed. (116-4296)

19) Dave Teeple - Special Assistant to AEC Chairman Lewis Strauss.

20) John Walker - a New York attorney and former employee of the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy.

21) Frank Cetter - present Security Officer for the Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy.

22) Hans Bethe - atomic scientist, University of Chicago. Previously interviewed concerning this matter.
